




There were 69 unique IP addresses among the respondents. This is likely due to multiple devices in a single home, sharing an external IP address.




Being a part of their organization was great and an asset. However we didn't benefit as much because our season wasn't expanded. Thus the heater provided didn't have as big of impact as it should have.
